Forget Santa. The Bible says that God sees everything in His creation, and nothing is hidden from His sight.

None of the things we've done, said, or thought are hidden from Him.

Even if we're good at hiding the dodgier bits of our lives from the people around us, we can't hide them 🎇 from God.

God is the one who made everything, sees everything, and records everything.

God is the one to whom we must give an account of our lives.

We can't hide anything from God.

When the Bible says that nothing in all creation is hidden from God's sight, it means nothing.

Everything is exposed before the eyes of God (even our thoughts and attitudes) 2 - and we are answerable to Him.

If there is a naughty and a nice list, and God has seen all of our lives, then the Bible tells us that we are all on the naughty list!

We may have done some lovely, kind and good things in our lives, but we've also done some horrible, unkind and bad things too.
